BY AIR

Cologne-Bonn airport (terminal 1/2): **Airport express SB 60 to Bonn**; get off at Brüdergasse/Bertha-von-Suttner-Platz/Bonn-Innenstadt (duration: 27 min.); walk to conference venue, either via Wenzelgasse or via Belderberg (duration each: 4 min.)
