OVERVIEW

Awareness and support for heritage sites depend upon the level of knowledge that people have about their significance. However, some sites do not lend themselves easily to being understood by an observer. Ruins and archaeological sites, for example, require special efforts to be interpreted for visitors due to their incomplete and damaged state. Equally challenging are landscapes of memory, i.e. places where important events occurred, but few material remains are left behind as testimonies thereof. In these cases, it falls to heritage professionals to develop interpretation and presentation strategies in order to allow for a thorough visitor experience and accessibility of meaning to a wider audience.

BTU Cottbus-Senftenberg and Helwan University are organising the conference 'Past Imperfect. Communicating the Fragment and the Incomplete' which aims to facilitate an exchange on recent developments and project experiences on this specific issue. In particular, the focus will be placed on archaeological sites, ruins and landscapes of memory.
