Hydraulic Engineering Repository HENRY celebrates 5,000th Open Access Publication

Karlsruhe, 1st of June 2018 HENRY, the Hydraulic Engineering Open Access Repository, accepted the 5,000th publication to its data base on 30th May 2018. This marks an important milestone towards establishing HENRY as a leading international resource for Hydraulic Engineering professionals.


HENRY was launched in mid-2017 by the German Federal Waterways Engineering and Research Institute (BAW) offering its users thousands of free full-text publications on Hydraulic Engineering in either English or German. In addition to publishing the work of its own researchers in HENRY, the BAW also invites other members of the international research community for Hydraulic Engineering (individual researchers and organisations alike) to upload their work to HENRY. By pursuing this crowdsourcing approach, the BAW is striving to build the largest and most important technical repository in the discipline worldwide.

HENRY is part of the BAW's open access strategy and reflects its ambition to provide research information to its clients in a way that accommodates both the effects of rapid digitalisation and a shift in its customers' expectations. In the coming years, the BAW plans to extend HENRY to also include an open data portal granting researchers free access to research data.
