„Global Zero” – A World Free of Nuclear Weapons?

In January 2007 four eminent American elder statesmen - George Shultz, William Perry, Henry Kissinger and Sam Nunn - launched their “global zero”-initiative. They called for the elimination of all nuclear weapons worldwide by 2023 and for the complete dismantling of all remaining nuclear warheads over the following seven years. Rarely has an idea created more interest and debate in politics and academia. Pursuing Global Zero even became one of the principal objects of American foreign policy with President Obama’s speech in Prague in April 2009.

What are the pros and cons of the initiative? Why does Washington declare “global zero” a pivotal foreign policy goal? What does it mean for NATO which always relied on nuclear weapons as an essential part of its deterrence strategy? Can “global zero” alter the dynamics of nuclear proliferation in the Middle East and put pressure on Iran to abandon its enrichment program?

These and other questions will be discussed by outstanding international experts at the University of Regensburg. The two-day-conference is jointly organized by the Hanns Seidel Foundation and the Institute of International and Transatlantic Relations at the University of Regensburg.
