

## Der Mitteldeutsche Archäologentag

wird jährlich vom Landesamt für Denkmalpflege und Archäologie Sachsen-Anhalt veranstaltet. Die internationale Tagung greift jeweils eine ausgewählte archäologische Thematik auf, um ausgehend von Funden oder Befunden Mitteldeutschlands im interdisziplinären Diskurs neue Erkenntnisse zu gewinnen.

Im Mittelpunkt des diesjährigen Kongresses steht die Geschichte von (Be)Kleidung in der Steinzeit, die über direkte und indirekte Belege in ihrer evolutionären und sozialen Bedeutung betrachtet wird. Ausgehend von frühen Belegen von Bekleidung bzw. deren Herstellung wie den Funden der Bestattung der Schamanin von Bad Dürrenberg in Sachsen-Anhalt sowie weiteren nationalen und internationalen Befunden sollen auf der Tagung verschiedene Aspekte der Geschichte der Bekleidung in der Steinzeit diskutiert werden. Die adressierten Themen reichen von der Notwendigkeit bis hin zu sozialen Dimensionen der Bekleidung.

## The Archaeological Conference of Central Germany

is held every year by the State Office for Heritage Management and Archaeology Saxony-Anhalt. Taking an interdisciplinary approach, the aim of the international conference is to gain new insight on a specially selected subject by studying finds and features from Central Germany and beyond.

This year's conference is devoted to the history of Stone Age clothing and examines its evolutionary and social significance using both direct and indirect evidence. Based on early evidence of clothes and their manufacture such as the finds from the burial of a female shaman from Bad Dürrenberg in Saxony-Anhalt as well as other features from Germany and abroad, conference participants will discuss various aspects of the history of clothing in the Stone Age.

Various topics will be addressed, ranging from clothing as a necessity to their social dimension.

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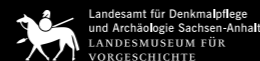

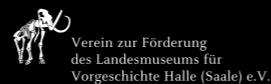
